The [2011 Golden Globes](#) was all about drama. Specifically, a movie that chronicles the drama of amassing 500 million friends ("The Social Network"), a television show that explores high-school drama via catchy song-and-dance numbers ("Glee") and a ballerina's dramatically gruesome descent into madness ("Black Swan") were among the big winners Sunday night.

"The Social Network" scored one of the two big film honors of the night, "Best Motion Picture - Drama," as well as Best Screenplay, Best Director and Best Original Score. "Glee" ran things on the television side, taking home Best Television Series - Comedy or Musical, while [Chris Colfer](#) and [Jane Lynch](#) nabbed best supporting actor and actress wins.
